- Reduce or stop pain, some conditions cause painfulliving which is over burdening the child. Stopping it is our goal
- Restore or create abilities through correction of deformities and working on encouraging functional compensation.

BABIRYE'S SUCCESS STORY

Babirye Catherine was 9 year with knock knees when her mother brought her at NRC to seek some advice because of her then worsening condition, they came from Kyabayima-Manyogaseka subcounty in Mubende district. Looking at a joyful/ cerebrating mother of Cathy, we demanded her experience with her child's former condition. She seemed so motivated to unveil the cause of her joy and here are her narrations. "I got Cathy as a healthy baby and I was glad to have a baby girl but later when my child was starting to walk, I realised that my child's movements were being encumbered by a disabling condition. Legs kept knocking each other and she often fell or failed to do some activities. It became worse and worse. Some people from the community started staring at her and nick naming her certain names, this always hurt me but I had nothing to do. I was often advised on what to do from the different herbalists, but it didn't work out. But now seeing her able to stand straight and walk normally, I feel relieved. Even as she went through pain to achieve this, it worth it! Cathy got several surgeries with the help from Namutamba RC and she was cared for well for the long time we have been here.
